

At the Podium - Alex Farnham - Making a Movie in HI



Alexander Dane Farnham was born in Burlington, Vermont on October 16, 1987. He moved to Kailua Kona, Hawaii at age five and attended public school until enrolling in Hualalai Academy, a private school strong in the performing arts. After graduating from the Academy he attended L.A. Film School where he completed a 12 month immersion course in filmaking, with concentrations in acting, directing and editing.

Alex started making videos when he was 12 years old and completed his first commercial film when he was 14. After

graduating from film school, he started making videos for distribution on YouTube. His primary channel, MockStars, has garnered over 60 million YouTube views and has over 250 thousand subscribers. His videos are predominately comical and cover a variety of timely subjects, especially in the world of entertainment.

Now into filmaking, he has completed one feature film, One Million Dolla, now in marketing, and two more in post production, Terrestrial and Entity. His latest, Entity, was filmed at the Aloha Theatre in Kainaliu, using several local actors and personalities. His talk is about the making of this film.

Tammy Passmore has been a resident of the Big Island for the last 19 years. Tammy's passion for serving communities for the last 33 years of her working career in Government, State and non-profits, now includes providing and caring for working canines. Due to budget restraints, these beloved animals, with their love for service, dedication, and loyalty, are underutilized. They are an integral part of the protection, safety, and loyalty of our community. For these reasons

Tammy founded and established the Hawaii Island K9 Association. Tammy has dedicated herself for the last 5 years not only to seek the funds to implement and enhance the underfunded utilization of working canines throughout the island, but has taken on the personal task of training and certifying her own canine as an emotional support therapy K9 for the Pet Partners organization, where Jax (her canine) will be of service at the Queens North Hawaii Community Hospital.
